On Wednesday nights @ 6:30pm, we offer ministries for the whole family. Childcare is available for toddlers (ages 2 -4yrs) in the Nursery. Our Explorers ministry (children ages 5 thru 5th Gr), and Unashamed Youth ministry (students in Grades 6-12) all meet in the basement. We also have an adult LIFE group meets upstairs in the Conference Room.

On **Sunday mornings** @ **9am**, there is an **Adult Bible Class** that meets downstairs in the Youth Room. We dig into God's Word together, unpacking its meaning and seeking to understand how to apply the Scriptures in everyday life.

Every Sunday at 10am, we host a **Connection time**. Join us for food & beverages in the gym, along with uplifting conversations. You can also purchase a specialty coffee or latte at the **Unashamed Coffee kiosk.** All proceeds support the Unashamed Youth ministries.

At the 10:30am Sunday Service, we offer a a staffed Nursery (for babies & toddlers up to 3 yrs old). We also have a **Children's Church** time midway thru the service. GIVING TO ALLIANCE MISSIONS IN 2024

There are 5 different ways to financially support Alliance missions. You can always write a check to FAC, and designate your gift on the memo line for the Great Commission Fund (GCF) or to a specific IW (by name). To give online, go to this link: <u>https://secure.cmalliance.org/give/</u>

Once you arrive, you will be given at least 4 different giving options:

You may give an undesignated gift to the **Great Commission Fund (GCF).** This covers the IW's compensation, travel, and basic ministry & operating budgets. Generous undesignated giving is crucial for the Alliance to launch new initiatives to reach the unreached.

You may give to **A Worker You Love** – this giving is applied directly to the IW that you've identified. It provides a portion of their compensation and allows the IW to direct funds toward strategic ministry needs or other things they are doing to create access to the Gospel.

You may give to **A Project You Love** – this giving is aimed at a specific project that has been approved by the Alliance leadership team where your IW serves.

You may also give to **Relief & Development (CAMA Services)** – this giving is used to help the most vulnerable in our world, to recover from disasters and to assist people to build a sustainable lifestyle the world's most challenging places.



Recent Governing Board News

We welcomed four new people to the Governing Board at our January meeting (Kelly, Tom, Janelle and Lynette). It is exciting to have a great mixture of both old and new leaders, giving leadership to our church family. Please keep our Board in prayer each month, as we prayerfully consider action steps that will grow FAC and expand the impact of the Kingdom here in Billings.

Tom Seroogy, is leading a small Financial Review team, to go over the 2023 financial records. Once the review is complete, the team will make recommendations to the Board on how to continue to strengthen our financial checks & balances.

The Board endorsed our new partnership with Communio, and we're very grateful for the good participation in the Relational Health Survey. We learned that while there is a strong foundation of healthy marriage relationships in FAC, and that 81% of our people were raised in homes that included both a father and mother. We also discovered that 10% of our surveyed families have step children. Among those who are singles, almost 60% feel left or lacking in companionship at FAC.

Pray with us, as we form a Connection Team, and begin to map out a strategy to strengthen marriages & relationships with FAC, even as we look for new ways to connect with couples, families and singles outside the walls of First Alliance in the coming months...
